Living in a city like Christchurch has its benefits for a small congregation like GBC: we enjoy the presence of visitors from various countries as well as from around New Zealand. In the past few weeks tourists have come from Singapore, the USA and the UK, as well as friends from Hamilton and Auckland. While we would love to have more people come who would stay permanently, it is a great encouragement to have this brief fellowship with these brothers and sisters.

On Sunday 21st December we will be having our Christmas Gospel Service, having leafleted 2000 homes in the area around where we meet during the preceding week.

Dafydd & Maria will be away in the UK during January (7-24), so we are looking forward to ministry from David Yan (11th) and Graham Capill (18th) while Dafydd ministers in Aberystwyth, Wales (11th) and he and Maria have a thanksgiving service on the 17th for family and friends who were unable to get to their wedding. More immediately, two families (Hughes & Moores) are moving house over the next few days.

## MANUKAU CENTRAL BIBLE FELLOWSHIP CHURCH

After 17 years of ministry amongst us Peter and Margaret Reynolds were farewelled on November 27 by the MCBFC church family and alumni. It was an evening of fellowship, photos, speeches and gifts. Peter and Margaret leave NZ on December 27 to pursue further studies at Covenant Theological Seminary in Missouri.

In October Dawie Malan was inducted into the eldership of MCBFC. This December Dawie will finish his studies at Grace Theological College and with his family will be travelling to South Africa, returning mid-February.

### **NORTHSHORE BAPTIST REFORMED CHURCH**

A good number of people turned out for a special Christmas Service on December 7<sup>th</sup>, in which the Sunday School children participated. It followed the theme, "My Story of Christmas," and people from different cultures spoke briefly about their different approaches to Christmas. The previous week the church was encouraged in witnessing the baptism, at Castor Bay, of six young people from the congregation. In February and March 2004 a number of people are participating in a short term 'mission' trip to Papua New Guinea.

Our monthly service at a Howick old-people's home and hospital continues to be a time of real blessing. Despite their frailty - or perhaps because of it - these people are very receptive to the Gospel and month by month show wonderful signs of God's grace.

We will be holding no services January 4 and 11 - those who are not away on holiday are being encouraged to visit other Auckland churches.
