GRACE BAPTIST CHURCH, CHRISTCHURCH

We enjoyed the ministry of John Leever early in July and of Stephen Turner at the end of the month (Stephen also spoke about his visit to India and Sri Lanka and showed a very interesting video of the Indian segment of his trip). Daphne Sterne was rushed in to hospital about the middle of July, and in August she had heart surgery; we are thankful to God that she is recovering well and is now at home once more.

It has been a quiet couple of months for the church, with the usual routine of meetings. Dafydd is currently preaching through 2 Peter on Sunday mornings, and the Discipleship Group has just finished working through an excellent book by Wayne Mack on the Local Church entitled *Life in the Father's House*. Other books in the pipeline include *A Reformed Baptist Manifesto*, *Christianity Among the New Zealanders*, and Bunyan's *The Holy War*. Our Wednesday evening Bible Studies continue to use video material as the basis for discussion: we have recently completed a series by R. C. Sproul on "Pleasing God" and have begun a short series by Peter Masters of Spurgeon's Metropolitan Tabernacle entitled "The Contrast of the Covenants".

GRACE REFORMED BAPTIST FELLOWSHIP, PALMERSTON NORTH

We continue to thank God for His goodness as we seek to establish a work for His Name and His glory in Palmerston North. Recent visitors have included an Egyptian lady and a Hong Kong family – both of whom have recently moved into town. Fine winter weather has led to a number of extended conversations during outreach in the Square on the last three opportunities on Saturday mornings. We are thankful for Trevor Keam's contribution on two of these occasions. However we find ourselves repeatedly bumping into a group who are preaching another gospel (in effect justification by speaking in tongues). They also need to hear the gospel and realise that we are saved by grace through faith in Christ, but we need much wisdom in dealing with such people, especially when their group of 20 or so disperse across the Square to peddle their heresy. We are thankful that He that is in us is greater than he that is in the world - how we need to know the strength of the Holy Spirit as we take this stand for the Lord.

Lord willing, we are looking forward to hosting the next meeting of the Fellowship of Reformed Baptist Churches in New Zealand (FRBCNZ) on Saturday 24th September. We are planning a series of seminars that afternoon, including a seminar given by Peter Somervell (Wanganui East Baptist Church) on the power of the gospel. Pray that the Lord would bless this occasion and be pleased to strengthen and equip His people for His service.

On Sunday morning 21st our dear brother Vic Lambert was called home to be with his Lord. There were three speakers. Dominic Tennant told us about his conversion experience last year. Tony Howard gave a very interesting account of the life and testimony of a noted Christian scientist. Kevin Gore presented a short address outlining the ABCs of the gospel.

At the recent AGM the church elected a second elder, Robin Wilkins.

Trinity is now served by a strong and unified team of two elders and two deacons. The pastor, David Marshall, was reaffirmed for another four year term as teaching elder and pastor, and was granted two months long service leave in October and November. Due to the generosity of a number of friends in New Zealand and Australia most of the Marshall family will be able to fly to Australia for an extended visit to see family and friends and something of their homeland.

Several men visit the Frankton Market, in Commerce Street near the church, on most Saturday mornings to hand out tracts and to talk to any who are interested in the Christian faith. We use a number of tracts, especially one designed by a former member, Trevor Keam.

David recently concluded a series of sermons through the book of Hebrews and has now begun to work through the book of James. During the evening services he is preaching through 1 Corinthians.
