We have now settled into the excellent new venue at Heaton Intermediate School. We have had visiting speakers on 12 occasions since March. We are still very conscious and grateful for the support of the other churches in the fellowship. Our midweek meetings in John's gospel have been an encouragement as we study Gods word together; we have now completed up to John 11. The Church would value prayer for leadership in the church and provision of a pastor. We plan a combined church camp with Marchwiell on Nov 17-19; this year our speaker is Peter Somervell.

We give thanks to God that on Saturday 22nd July 2006 Grace Reformed Baptist Church was formally and publicly constituted in Palmerston North in a service of thanksgiving. This represents significant progress for the work of the Lord in this region, almost a year and a half after two families began meeting together in February 2005 with the intention of establishing a formally constituted church. Whilst only one of those families remains, the Lord has surely heard and answered prayer and blessed this work. On 22nd July eight

founding members were joined in the service of thanksgiving by representatives from every member church of the Fellowship of Reformed Baptist Churches in New Zealand, as well as a number of friends from around the region. In the Lord's wonderful provision, the church constitutes with an eldership of three. David Marshall gave the charge to the members, elders and pastor. David Yan preached from 1 Corinthians 1:18-25, a highly appropriate message given the church's watchword, "Proclaiming Christ". He reminded the congregation of God's work in salvation: bringing worldly wisdom to nothing and saving through the preaching of Christ crucified, who is the power and wisdom of God. He exhorted the church to depend upon God's power in brokenness and humility, to be assured that the preaching of Christ will save and therefore to be zealous in proclaiming Christ.

We pray that the Lord would continue to bless this work to the glory of His Name. The first week of August we leafleted the whole city with 24,000 evangelistic tracts which include our contact details and times of Sunday services, and we are beginning plans for an evangelistic Sunday School. The Lord has continued to build His church here: we have just welcomed Stephen Smith (formerly of Marchwiell) into membership, and there are others who have worshipped with us irregularly over the past few weeks.

We are almost at the end of a series of insightful and Christ-honouring messages on the book of Habakkuk, given by Ian Grant. Two of his recent sermon titles have been Confused? In July we conducted our annual Holiday Kid's Club. We were encouraged by the largest number of children attending thus far, an average of more than 50 each day. It was also wonderful to have more children from non-Christian homes than ever before. Our own folk rallied around to help with the running of the programme and we were blessed with helpers from seven other Hamilton churches. The theme was *Trash and Treasure*. The Bible stories each day were about Job, Ruth, Mephibosheth, Jeremiah, and the woman of Samaria. The children made some very high quality craft items, and two groups enjoyed constructing a cardboard Viking long boat and a cardboard space rocket, which we used for a series of races on the final day.

Our preaching programme has been from the Gospel of John in the mornings; while in the evenings we have had series of messages on The Biblical Covenants and more recently have begun a series working through the book of Leviticus. We have been conducting a bimonthly service in the Trevellyn Rest Home. In July we held a church concert at the Home on a Saturday evening. John Featherstone was the M.C. of a very pleasant evening.

A Special Pot Luck Dinner at the home of John and Val Featherstone was entertained with a fascinating video of John and Val's tramping trip through part of eastern Nepal.
