- Grace Baptist Church, Christchurch—

In our regular Sunday morning services we have been looking into the book of Romans and particularly highlighting aspects of the doctrine of salvation. We pray that this will help us become those who consistently preach Christ and Him crucified, and those who live to the praise of His glorious grace. We are also running a series of meetings on some Saturday evenings aiming to better equip ourselves to be able share the biblical gospel and to give an answer for the hope that is in us (1Peter 3:15).

The next few months will see some additional opportunities for us to be involved in the spreading of the Gospel. On Sunday September 20 we will have a table at the Rolleston Community Centre Open Day, informing people of our Sundays@4.30 meetings, and seeking to make further contacts in that community. From September 29 to October 2, people from the church will also be involved in the FAB Club, a regular childrens holiday program also held at the Rolleston Community Centre.

Then we will be working with other churches at the A & P Show here in Christchurch (11-13 November) to engage people with the gospel of God's grace. Our third annual School of Theology was held in August. We had thirteen men from New Zealand and Australia, with Dr Jim Renihan again teaching. "Has science got rid of God?" on Saturday 26th September; "Does God believe in atheists?" on Saturday 17th October; and "Is God past his sell-by date?" on Saturday 14th November.
