### **BAYS BAPTIST CHURCH, AUCKLAND**

Bruwer arrived back safely after spending time with Zack Eswine in St Louis, USA. This comes with great thanks for the support he received while there and also for the help from Bays in helping his family move house on the day of their arrival back in Auckland. During the last number of weeks we've enjoyed new visitors attending our worship service. We're praying for them and for others who might be encouraged by the fellowship and join with us.

We look forward to the ministry in the year ahead, seeking the Lord's provision for the work – we have need for your prayers in this regard also. We continue to set this before God and asking for the strength to trust him with our need.

### **CROSSPOINT CHURCH, PALMERSTON NORTH**

We are greatly encouraged by the number of visitors who drop in to both our morning and evening services: rarely does more than two or three weeks pass without there being someone new present: if only they would return and hear more of the word of life!

We are also greatly encouraged at the prospect of a baptism and the addition of four adults to our membership on the last Sunday of March, the Lord willing. While these are people who have been worshipping regularly with us for between five months and three or four years, it will be an enormous blessing to have them more actively involved in the life of the church.

At the beginning of May we are sending Dafydd to accompany and assist Stephen Turner in his annual India Studies. Dafydd will be helping in the Pune studies, but he will also briefly visit the Coonoor group (where Mike Beck has been assisting) as this will be Stephen's final trip to that location: various members of our church have been prayerfully supportive of this ministry since its inception about a quarter of a century ago and Dafydd is keen to see the place and meet some of the men who have been a part of it.

Finally, we are also looking forward to hosting our next School of Theology at which Dr Jim Renihan will be teaching on the Doctrines of Grace. The dates are 13-17 July 2015 and details are being added to our website ([crosspoint.org.nz](http://crosspoint.org.nz)).

We have had a busy start to the year with our combined church camp with Marchwiel Reformed Baptist Church and Rolleston Baptist Church (15-17 February) at Wainui on the Banks Peninsula; our 20th anniversary of a church the following weekend; the hosting of the first FRBCNZ meeting of the year; and the hosting of the first Roving Classroom session of 2015 (14 March) where we hope that around 35 people from several churches will gather to consider the Trinity and the Person of Christ from the perspective of historical theology. We are thankful for these opportunities of wider fellowship and mutual encouragement.

We are continuing a series on Luke's Gospel in our Sunday services and have begun looking into principles of biblical interpretation in our midweek studies. We also look to the Lord for the appointment of a new elder in April, and pray that others would be raised up as elders and deacons in the days ahead.

April, Lord willing, will also see both a wedding (Simon & Cora) and the birth of a child to Jonathan & Simone. May the Lord strengthen the marriages and families of Grace Baptist Church as we look to Him as our Wisdom and Strength.
